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- Engaging political leadership early in the process
- Deeper Community Partnerships and Community rooted conversations
- Training Week expanded to (2) weeks
- Site visits and tours prior and post training week
- Networking opportunities for cohort during and post-training
- Larger bucket of Funding
 - Both for training and for the cohort to use as pre-development funding
