ITEM 6 Presentation: Analyzing Bank Reinvestment Activities

The Senior Vice President for CRA Strategy and Operations at Union Bank, Jan Woolsey, will provide an overview of the Community Reinvestment Act and discuss how banks plan and measure their community development activities, what data banks collect for compliance with federal regulations, and how community members can access, analyze and interpret this data for the benefit of their communities.

This presentation is part of the Reinvestment Task Force's continuing investigation into how to create the best mechanisms for measuring and monitoring the lending, investment, grantmaking and service activities San Diego banks. Ms. Woolsey's report and the accompanying discussion will help inform the RTF's current effort to create a universal form for local banks to report their reinvestment activities to a variety of stakeholders, policymakers and governmental bodies.
