ITEM 5 <u>APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES</u>

The minutes of the May 21, 2015 regular meeting was approved on a motion by Ed Lopez, seconded by Manny Aguilar, and passed by a vote of 12-0.

ITEM 6 Information Item: San Diego Regional Transportation Plan

Susan Baldwin, SANDAG's Senior Regional Planner, briefed the RTF on the Draft Regional Plan, aka San Diego Forward, which was released for public comment in April. The plan combines and updates the region's two big-picture planning documents – the Regional Comprehensive Plan (RCP) and the Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (RTP/SCS).

The new regional plan has been underway for three years and will guide development – and principally transit-oriented development – across the county. The plan's main goal is accommodating projected population increases through responsible management of transportation and land use growth. The new plan increases densification along transit corridors while reducing future density in rural areas as compared to previous plans.

SANDAG has held workshops throughout the region to obtain input on the Draft Plan. SANDAG's Board of Directors is expected to adopt the blueprint for growth in the fall.

RTF comments and discussion touched on transit needs, job growth forecasts, NIMBYism, multifamily and affordable housing development, technological change, and the plan's responsiveness to long-term changes in land use planning as well as community preferences.
